## RECENT THEORETICAL AND RESEARCH PROGRAMS

### VIEWING PERSONALITY AS A SYSTEM

I view personality as a system, and the discipline of personality psychology as focused on understanding four topics related to it: defining what personality is, describing the parts of personality, outlining personality's organization, and characterizing how personality develops. I refer to this approach as the *personality systems framework* and I've written that the framework provides a useful integration for the field of personality psychology. In 2005, I wrote an article describing the framework in the *American Psychologist* (2005). Since then, I have been invited to write articles on the framework for the journal *Social and Personality Compass* (2011), as well as for special issues of the journal the *Review of General Psychology* (2013) and the *Journal of Research in Personality* (2015).

### STRUCTURAL MODELS OF PERSONALITY

A good first view of personality, according to the *personality systems framework*, is at the level of its organization, specifically its long-term stable connections to neighboring systems, and its internally-functioning systems (technically, personality's structural organization). Personality connects to such neighboring systems as the brain, the social setting, situations, and groups. The personality system further includes internal areas that carry out its major functions: personality's energy development, knowledge guidance, self-management, and action planning. This structural organization of personality is described in a number of articles (e.g., Mayer, 2003; 2005; 2015).

## EMOTIONAL AND PERSONAL INTELLIGENCES

I am particularly interested in the intelligences that personality draws on to function. Much 20<sup>th</sup> century research examined “cool” or cognitive intelligences. I am very interested in “hot” intelligences – those that deal with personalized, ego-relevant information. In 1990, Peter Salovey and I claimed that there existed an as-of-then unmeasured intelligence, *emotional intelligence*, which functioned alongside verbal/crystalized and spatial/fluid intelligence. Since that time, I developed measures of emotional intelligence with Dr. Salovey, Dr. David Caruso and other colleagues.

More recently, I suggested that there also exists a somewhat broader *personal intelligence*. Personal intelligence involves the abilities to reason about personality and personality-related information. I featured the theory in a 2014 book *Personal intelligence: The power of personality and how it shapes our lives* (Scientific American/Farrar, Straus & Giroux), and am developing tests that measure personal intelligence and what it predicts.

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### A. Earlier Web Outreach

In addition to my public speaking and many radio appearances recently, I maintain online websites, the first begun in July of 2004, with the aim of fostering responsible public education regarding emotional intelligence, personal intelligence and personality psychology more generally. Between 2004 and March 15<sup>th</sup>, 2010, the emotional intelligence website had 367,900 visitors as of March 15<sup>th</sup> 2010.
